Songs for the Summer

From nursery rhymes to school assembly anthems to chants on the terraces to singing along to our favourite hits in the car, or the shower, we all find ourselves singing at some point or another. Studies have shown that belting out a tune or singing in a choir can enhance our mood, boost our immune system or even reduce feelings of chronic pain.

Our recent Community Choir initiative drew people from different walks of life and parts of the parish to sing together at Christmas and Easter. Including some who are trained singers, some who self-described as "tone-deaf" and everything in between. All who took part described a real sense of enjoyment and fun – another testimony of the power of music and song.

For centuries music and singing have been a central part of worship in churches. The rhythm of a hymn or the simple melody of a song, combined with words that express deep truths, have a unique ability to connect us with each other and with the God we worship.

In the Bible, the book of Psalms is a rich collection of songs and prayers that have been sung by God's people for thousands of years. The Psalms cover an extraordinary range of human experiences, from deep despair to exuberant joy, and they help us to express our deep emotions to our God. Whilst faith in his promises is often where they take us in the end, the Psalms have a unique way of giving voice to our struggles and doubts too. Their place at the heart of Scripture reminds us that we have a God who is not distant or aloof but who wants to have a real living relationship with us. Like all of Scripture the Psalms ultimately point us to Jesus Christ as the one who came so we can relate to God again. Theologian Christoper Ash writes: "If the gospels give us Christ's deeds and word, the Psalms open a window into his heart."

Over the next few weeks in our churches, as well as joining our voices each week in hymns and songs, we'll be exploring a few of these Psalms in more depth to see how they can help us to express ourselves and respond to God in ways that are life giving.

In case you're wondering whether your singing ability is up to it or not, I'm always encouraged by Psalm 100v1 which encourages us to "make a joyful noise...!"



Helping with the hydrangeas.



News from Clift Surgery

The surgery is pleased to announce two new doctors, **Dr Laura Champion**, is specialising in diabetes with Dr Ward and **Dr Katherine White**, who is involved with training. Both doctors trained at Clift Surgery and are delighted to be back with us.

The surgery has also welcomed a new Health Care Assistant **Jo Walker**.

Did you know that people aged 40 – 74 are entitled to a Health Check?

The NHS Health Check is a free check-up of your overall health. It can tell you whether you're at higher risk of getting certain health problems, such as: heart disease, diabetes, kidney disease, stroke. During the check-up you'll discuss how to reduce your risk of these conditions. If you're aged over 65, you'll also be told about symptoms of dementia to look out for.

Who is the NHS Health Check for?

The check is for people who are aged 40 to 74 who do not have some pre-existing conditions. See https://www.nhs.uk/tests-and-treatments/nhs-health-check.

How do I get an NHS Health Check?

If eligible, you should be invited to an NHS Health Check by your GP every 5 years. If you think you are eligible but have not been invited, contact your GP surgery.

What happens at an NHS Health Check?

Your NHS Health Check will usually be done by a nurse, but it could also be a doctor, pharmacist or healthcare assistant.

The check takes about 20 to 30 minutes and usually includes:

 measuring your height and weight, measuring your waist, a blood pressure test, a cholesterol test, and possibly a blood sugar level test, which is usually a finger-prick blood test. You may be asked to have a blood test at or before the NHS Health Check

You'll also be asked some questions about your health including:

 whether any of your close relatives have had any medical conditions; if you smoke, and how much; if you drink alcohol, and how much; how much physical activity you do. Your age, gender and ethnicity will also be recorded.

Your NHS Health Check results:

You'll usually be told your NHS Health Check results during the appointment.

You'll be given your cardiovascular risk score of developing a heart or circulation problem, such as heart disease, stroke, type 2 diabetes or kidney disease, over the next 10 years.

Everybody's cardiovascular risk rises with age, so the next time you have an NHS Health Check your risk score may be higher, even if your test results are the same.

There are some things about your risk which you cannot change, such as your age, ethnicity and family history. But the most important factors in your risk score (such as smoking, your cholesterol level and blood pressure) can be changed. You will receive advice on how to improve your scores if needed.

This is an important check up, so please remind friends and relatives to take up this offer.





Bramley Poppy Appeal Organiser

Bramley RBL seeks a new Poppy Appeal Organiser. The current organiser is moving house away from the village, after doing the role for 8 years.

As Poppy Appeal Organiser, you would be responsible for ordering poppy stocks, co-ordinating a team of collectors, receiving the collections, banking Poppy money and completing Poppy paperwork. That's it in a nutshell.

If you have experience in managing more or less anything you would be qualified, once trained, to perform the role. Although it's a year-round position, it's voluntary, and would best suit someone who is either retired or who can spare about 6 weeks from mid-October in a full time role, and who could be available for a couple of Poppy Organiser conferences during the rest of the year. Counting the money is easier these days, as about half of all donations are

via card machine. There is a coin counting machine which can be borrowed from St James Church for the metal money. Other responsibilities include ordering wreaths for local organisations and individuals to be laid during the Remembrance period, and running a stall at the village fetes in the area.

The area covered by Bramley includes Sherborne St John, Monk Sherborne, Ramsdell, and Hartley Wespall. There is also a desk in Reception at North Hampshire Hospital for two weeks every year, which raises nearly half of all donations in the area. There will be a handover document available which describes how the Poppy Appeal has been run up to now.

Women's Fellowship

The speaker was Terri Reid with an introduction by Stephen Reid, on the life and works of Cristabel Pankhurst.

Stephen explained that the talk was an 'in character presentation' with the first part being Cristabel's words taken from her speeches and writings.

Cristabel came from a socially and politically active family, her mother being Emmeline Pankhurst, leader of the Suffragete Movement and connected to the incident at the Epsom Derby when Emily Davison threw herself in front of King George V's

The talk began when in 1914 Cristabel gave her 'sisters in arms' speech, though the Women's Social & Political Union (WSPU) began in 1903 with her and her sisters' mother Emmeline.

Cristabel was criticised for favouring the educated middle classes whereas her sister Sylvia, with whom she subsequently fell out, was very much for all women to be freed from the tethers of menfolk, regardless of social standing.

Cristabel had a law degree but, because she was a woman, was not allowed to practise law She knew society had to change, but wanted to act in a nonmilitant way to fight for the vote for women. She was degraded and villified by men and led a campaign of 'Deeds not Words' and later imprisoned in both Holloway Women's prison and Bow Street, police station in London for various suffragette-related actions. She later moved to Manchester. Following her imprisonments she adopted more aggressive and militant tactics in order to gain the attention of the Government to address the issue of women's rights. The action took the form of breaking windows at 10 Downing Street, putting bombs through pillar boxes and going on hunger strike.

In 1917 the then Prime Minister David Lloyd George could see that women had been instrumental in the war effort of WW1, and in 1918 parliament considered changing the law to give women, over 30, the vote. But these women needed to be married, and be small property occupiers. This law then changed in 1928 to allow women aged 21 and over to have the vote, with the 'Equal Franchise Act' implemented.

Cristabel became disenchanted with women's priorities, e.g fashion and more trivial pursuits, and moved to the US, but returned briefly to the UK in the 1930's. She later returned to Los Angeles, where she died in 1958 aged 77 yrs.




